TOPPERS AND RESULTS

At the heart of the school is our mission to inspire a love of lifelong learning. Leading the way with scholarly accomplishments are our toppers of the academic year 2023-24.

This year, we are proud to announce truly outstanding results in the CBSE Board Exams:

- In Grade 12 Commerce, Liya Nazer achieved the highest score at 96%, including a perfect 100 in Informatics Practice.
- Alan Paul Salil emerged our Grade 12 Science topper with an impressive 95.4%.
- Our Grade 10 students also excelled, with all 20 passing and Fathima Zenha leading the way.
- This year too we proudly upheld our legacy of a 100% pass rate in both our Grade 10 and 12 board examinations

UNIVERSITY PLACEMENTS

Our graduates of the batch of 2023-24 have also already secured placements in prestigious universities, reflecting their hard work, dedication and the support they received from our faculty and wider community.

Outstanding Sports Achievements

TWS has also seen numerous triumphs in the sports arena.

- Ayush of Grade 11 secured 2 silvers and Anamika of Grade 12 secured 2 bronzes at the Kerala State Junior and Senior Taekwando Championships.
- Nia Naser of Grade 12 secured 1 gold and 1 bronze respectively in the Kerala state Junior Wushu Championship
- Ameena Razikh too made the school proud by securing a gold at the Kerala State sub junior wushu championship
- Fabil Hussain of Grade 12 was proclaimed the winner of the Kanur Open Tennis Championship
- Our football team reached the quarter finals of the CBSE Zonal Football Championship as well as the semifinals of the Sahodaya football championship.

SCHOOL STRATEGIC PLAN

This academic year our school strategic plan has focused on strengthening experiential learning through field visits and guest lectures, hands-on workshops and the newly introduced weekly club activities. A second area of focus for growth has been strengthening our ECA programme as well as the introduction of after-school sports programmes. Thirdly, digitizing our learning and administrative systems have also been a top-priority this year.

Experiential Learning at TWS

At TWS, learning extends well beyond the classroom and we firmly believe that our students learn best through experiencing real-world contexts.

- Field Trips: Since June 2024 alone, we have organised nearly 30 education field trips for various groups of students across curricula that enriched and extended their learning. Here are some memorable snapshots from these field trips.
- 2) Guest lecture series: We invited more than 20 guest speakers who are inspiring experts from diverse fields, who shared valuable insights and experiences that inspired our students. Some members of our parent community stepped forward to share their knowledge and expertise.
- 3) Hands-On Workshops: Our hands-on workshops such as workshops on safe touch and self-defense, anti-bullying, anti-drug abuse, menstrual hygiene, mental health awareness, road safety etc. were quite well-received, with participation and active engagement from all students. These workshops fostered practical knowledge and empowered our students greatly.

4) Weekly Club Activities: The newly introduced weekly club activities have seen participation from all students from Grade 1 onwards across various interests and passions, promoting personal development and collaboration across CBSE and IB.

ECA

Our second strategic objective of the year was strengthening our Extracurricular Activities (ECA) Program. We recognized the importance of a robust extracurricular program and took steps to enhance it by adding on new categories and specialised coaches and increasing the number of activity blocks.

After-School Sports Programs: The introduction of after-school sports programs has been a highlight, with over 56 students participating in sports like football, swimming, table tennis, badminton, basketball etc. This initiative has not only improved physical fitness and key skills but also built camaraderie among students.

Digitizing Learning and Administrative Systems

Our third strategic objective was to endeavour to further digitize our educational environment.

- Every classroom is now equipped with interactive panels and senses boards that allow for more engaging teaching and learning experiences.
- Our IB team's use of Toddle has also diversified, with AI powered tools that help with more learning analytics and insights, streamlined documentation, resources and assignments as well as evaluation of student work.
- MyClassBoard has been adopted by our team for reporting, documentation as well as for fee and admin related modules.
- The school has also adopted NeoTrack for easy RFID based tracking of our school buses making pick-ups and drops more convenient for our students and families

Professional Development

We continue to be strongly committed to the lifelong learning, training and development for our staff as well. This year, we organized various professional development sessions for teachers. Our staff also participated in workshops organised by external bodies and associations to further their knowledge, expertise and skills. Our mentors attended capacity building programmes and subject wise training programmes. Our leadership team the Principal's conference Kochi and other exposure visits.

Achievements in Literary & Cultural Events

Our students have also triumphed at the Malabar Sahodaya Kalotsav, bagging more than 20 accolades and A grade in numerous categories and events.

Several of our students have also emerged as top rankers in the State level spell bee conducted by Win Academy in Aluva.

Additionally, we had engaging activities like cricket and football matches between staff & students versus parents that strengthened our community ties.

EVENTS AND CELEBRATIONS

This year's calendar was abuzz with activities, beginning with The White School Marathon, and spanning several special days of events, celebrations, observances and even recreational trips.
